Welcome Back Shepard!

With the pandemic still raging it has seemed like a longer than usual three months and we look forward to Shepard resuming the helm at our Sunday services. Jack Jones has been working to get the sanctuary set up for live streaming, but until that is finalized, Shepard will resume conducting ZOOM services at our usual time, 10:00 a.m., beginning on Sunday October 4th. Shepard's return happens as the church tunes up for the important 2021 stewardship campaign so expect to hear from the Boards of Stewardship soon.

With Shepard's return, we also have a good-bye to say and some thanks to extend to those who covered for Shepard. Thank you to the Rev. Scott Morrow of the North Haven Congregational Church for allowing us to tap into their church's services streamed on You Tube. Scott also provided pastoral care starting in July and I have heard words of appreciation from members with whom he was in touch. The Rev. Mary Nelson kindly provided pastoral care coverage when Scott was on vacation. Thanks also to the Rev. Anya Powers for providing services while we were getting set up with North Haven and on Labor Day weekend. It is always a blessing to see one of our former interns, now an ordained minister, in the pulpit. I also want to thank the Board of Deacons for getting our services covered over the summer and their work in preparation for the upcoming Fall.

At the September Council meeting I raised the issue of conflict. I have noticed that the tone in which some of us communicate our differences with each other has become somewhat heated in the past few months and feel that we need to address this head on so that differences in the church can be settled in an amicable way that does not divide the congregation. We all have our own views about the church and we need to be cautious in how we express them knowing that other may or may not share the same view. I suggested to council that when they reconvene in October under a new

Moderator that the issue be on the agenda to which Council via a motion, agreed. I suggested that they consider whether we need to get some outside assistance in resolving our differences. The goal is to help the church move forward with enough unity to make out our pandemic stalled renewal process a success.

By the time this issue of the *Parishioner* is published, we will have had our September Congregational meeting with an agenda that combines the usual Fall meeting budget agenda with the agenda from the Annual meeting which we postponed due to the pandemic. Thus, we will have held elections for new Moderator, Clerk, and positions on Boards and Committees for positions that begin on October 1. Nominating has worked hard over the summer looking for candidates with little success. Although we will be opening up for nominations from the floor, we may have several positions unfilled. Let me remind you that between elections, positions can be filled via appointment by Council. So, if you decide at a later date that you are interested in serving as an officer or board/committee member, please be in contact with a member of the Nominating Committee; Judi Reynolds, Penny Rogers or Janice Touloukian.

As I close out my terms as Moderator, I would like to thank the congregation for their support; particularly Shepard, members of Council and those in the congregation who have supported me in my efforts and corrected me in my missteps. I also want to thank Bob Turner for his diligence, and Carole Prescott, Al Jarvis, Cathy Hubbard, and JoAnna Rubino who together have covered the church office, either as staff or as volunteer fill-ins, during my tenure.

Unfortunately, Covid will be a major factor in determining what First Church looks like in the near future, but I am hopeful that the church will come out on the other side of the pandemic stronger and more unified.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS REPORT, SEPTEMBER, 2020

General maintenance and grounds keeping has continued during the Covid shut-down.

A new well pump was installed at the Parsonage when the (very) old one failed.

Tree and building damages sustained during the two major summer tropical storms are either repaired or contracted for repair. Both Jim Rosson and the Woodbridge Public Works Department did a fantastic job cleaning up. Thank you both.

Bob Turner has repaired and installed storm windows in the choir practice room. He is also working on repairing some broken shutters.

Jeff Stauffer will replace broken shutters and one window pane damaged in the storms.

Joyce has been weeding the flower beds in preparation for the scheduled fall bush trimming and later mulching.

Jack Jones supervised the installation of Wi-Fi in the Sanctuary and is currently arranging for the equipment and software that will allow live streaming of events and Sunday Services from the Meetinghouse.

Since the outset of the covid-19 pandemic, the Board made special donations to the following four organizations for their special needs, especially food, housing, and medical necessities:

We have also researched and contributed in September to the Christian Baptist Church in Lake Charles, Louisiana for special needs in the aftermath of the hurricane there as well as ongoing pandemic related needs. The pastor there, The Rev. Alexander, expressed his deep appreciation for this assistance. Among other outreach, the Lake Charles church partnered with World Vision to distribute relief supplies on September 8. They have also used their web resources to communicate health and safety information to the community.
